



Camp Y-Koda Outreach Education

Designed for the classroom

These programs are designed especially for your classroom. Each program is approximately one hour in length (unless specified), and curriculum is written to satisfy Wisconsin Model Academic Standards. All outreach programs are \$2.90/student (unless specified), plus a round trip mileage fee of 40 cents/mile.

Bats

Don't bat your eyes at this one! Are bats beneficial or dangerous? We explore the species of bats that live here in Wisconsin. We will also investigate bat skulls and skeletons!
(Grade 2-5)

Frogs

Get a first hand look at what makes these creatures so unique. From their life cycle to their many adaptations. We bring live frogs and toads for a hippity-hoppity time.
(Grade Prek-3)

Snakes

We discuss what makes a snake so unique and students will have a hands-on experience when they hold camp snakes River and Sakia!
(Grade 1-8)

Owls \$3.00/student

Learn how owls have adapted to nighttime hunting, and listen to their unique calls. Students will see and touch wings, talons, and skulls. They will end the hour with an owl pellet dissection.
(Grade 1-5)

Wolves

Have you heard of the "Big Bad Wolf?" Nothing could be further from the truth. In this program students learn wolf facts, touch a wolf pelt, and look at a wolf skull. (Grade 3-8)

Groundwater

Students will estimate their own water usage, study water contamination using a groundwater model, and become a part of the water cycle through a hands-on game.
(Grade 4-8)

Mammals

Hands-on exploration of Wisconsin's mammals through fur and skull investigations. This is a great way to end a mammals unit.
(Grades 1-5)

Outdoor Survival

We put your class to the test as we involve them in a survival scenario and look at different kinds of outdoor equipment. The class will end outside with fire-building! (Grades 4-8)

Lumberjacks

How did Wisconsin become the state we see today? Lumberjacks largely influenced our history. Meet one of our lumberjacks as he shares life stories and shows some of the tools he used to make his living. Students cut into a log using a crosscut saw along with other activities. (Grades 4-6) 1.5 hour program

Map and Compass

We turn your school yard into a remote wilderness with a Camp Y-Koda designed compass course.
(Grades 4-8)

The Last Voyageur

Travel back in time to learn more about the fur trade and Native Americans during this time period. Students will see and feel numerous furs, and see the traditional voyageur outfit.
(Grade 4-8)
